

SGM Keith S. Henderson (MOARNG, ret.), age 68, of Jefferson City, MO, passed away Thursday, March 19, 2020 at the University Hospital in Columbia, Mo.


After leaving the Highway Patrol, he was employed with Burns Security at the Callaway Nuclear Plant.
