Marceline A. “Marcie” Branum, age 95, of Jefferson City, Mo., passed away peacefully Tuesday, June 9, 2020 at Heisinger Bluffs.

Marcie was born on October 31, 1924 in Argyle, Mo., the daughter of Edwin and Genevieve (Renfert)

Wildhaber. She was married on May 15, 1946 in Argyle, Mo. to Ralph E. Branum, who preceded her in death on March 9, 2015.

A lifelong resident of the central Missouri area, Marcie attended grade school in Argyle and was a 1941 graduate of Argyle High School.
