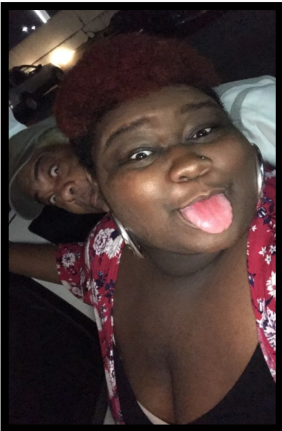
WHERE ROSES NEVER FADE
