thou goest; and how can we know the way?

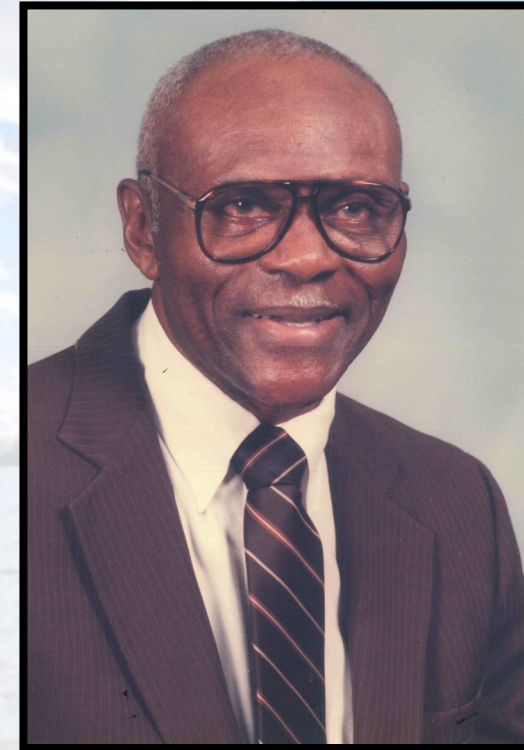
