
Peace Be Thine

Obituary

Mrs. Rosa Stevens Newsome, wife of the late Harold Newsome, departed this life on October 25, 2020. She was born in Greenville, South Carolina, to the late George and Cordelia Stevens.

Mrs. Newsome was a Physical Science school teacher where she graduated from and taught at Sterling High School. She also taught at Bakers Chapel Elementary School, Beck High School and J. L. Mann High School. In her lifetime she literally taught thousands of students.

She was a member of Macedonia Baptist Church, where she, as a child and a young adult, participated in many church activities including singing on the choir and teaching Sunday School, among others. She was also a member of the church Friendship Club. Rosa was the Quettes Club Charter Member, organizer of the Panache Bridge Club, and a member of GCTAR, NEAR, SCEA, Democratic Women and other organizations.

She was an avid traveler, having visited several countries on six continents. She graduated from Savannah State College where she received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Science.
