Noel’s Life...

NOEL TERRELL JR., son of the late Noel and Annie Bell Terrell, was born on March 16, 1935, in Louisburg, North Carolina. Noel, affectionately known as Junior to most, was called home to be with the Lord on August 10, 2020, at 85 years old. Noel received his formal education and high school diploma through the Franklin County School System. While growing up in Louisburg, NC, Noel worked in the fields with his father who was a sharecropper. Working on the farm during his childhood and adolescent years, inspired him to want more opportunities for a better life.

NOEL began a career in the military shortly after graduating from high school. In 1954, Noel enlisted in the United States Army and served three years. In 1959, he enlisted in the United States Navy where he served for 21 years as a Hull Technician. Noel retired after 24 years of service in the military, but he loved working on ships so much that he became a civilian Shipfitter. He was a member of the Fleet Reserve Association and of the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW).

His love for traveling can be directly attributed to his career in the military. Noel was a proud Navy Veteran who enjoyed traveling the world. The military afforded him many opportunities to travel throughout the land and sea. He relentlessly shared his experiences, mainly in France, Germany, and the Vietnam War with anyone willing to listen.

The military played a vital role in his life; he often spoke about how the military taught him the value of discipline, teamwork, and investing in a cause greater than himself. He would explain to loved ones how these values contributed to his life’s success. The discipline and patriotism he learned in the military never left him, as friends and family will attest.

NOEL confessed Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized at an early age. He was a member of Haywood Baptist Church where he was baptized. He grew up attending both Mitchell and Haywood Baptist churches. In fact, after retiring and returning to North Carolina, Noel traveled two hours to and from Haywood Baptist Church several times a week. He was a spiritual man, in-

involved in many church functions, serving in the male choir and as a Deacon at Haywood Baptist Church.

NOEL made a lasting impression on everyone who knew him. His energy, zest for life, and his ability to champion a career in any branch of the military, has been an inspiration to many family members and friends. Noel was a devoted father, grandfather, and mentor to many. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, working on his vehicles, and all things carpentry.

He was truly our renaissance man!

NOEL will forever be deeply missed and loved by his friends, family, and all who knew him. He was preceded in death by his brothers, Datis Earl Terrell, John Allen Terrell and J.C. Collins, and two sisters, Lucy Grey Terrell Aldridge and Marie Wylie.
