MR. MACK HENRY MCCANN passed away on Sunday, October 11, 2020 at the age of 87 years. He was born in Philadelphia, Mississippi on September 21, 1933.

He joined the United States Army as an Army Tactical Communication Signal Soldier (31G) during the Vietnam War. Mack retired in 1976 as a Commo Chief (31Z) after serving 22 years and 15 days. His Awards consist of Master Parachute Badge, Army Commendation Medal (3d OLC), Good Conduct Medal, Bronze Star Medal w/v device, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal w/device, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry w/Palm, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal and National Defense Medal. Mack retired from the Army, finally retiring from Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company after serving 20 plus years.
