

Richard Norman Hylton was born on Monday, November 21, 1949 to Girvin and Gloria Hylton in Kingston, Jamaica. He was the 4th of 8 Children. He spent his early years attending St. Michael's School in Rae Town, St. Andrews and Franklin Town Elementary Schools. He attended Vauxhall High School and also attended a small private school in Kingston.

Richard was a member of Franklin Town Church of God for many years, and of the Boys' Brigade. Having a strong Christian foundation, he often sang in church and became a young "missionary" when he and Dennis would take their Bibles and tell people about the Gospel. More recently, he attended Family Church Village in West Palm Beach. Richard was deeply religious and has always loved God. He never turned away from the Christian principles he learned as a child.

His first job in Jamaica was as an apprentice at Carrier Air Conditioning. Subsequently he began his auto parts sales career at Caledonia Motors in Kingston. His father, Girvin, taught him everything he knew about auto parts. He became an expert auto parts salesman. He was never too busy to help customers and family alike.

Richard migrated to the United States in 1968 to join his wife Veronica and their son Kevin, in Astoria, Queens. He also lived in East Elmhurst, Islip and Westbury, NY, and later moved to Florida. While in New York, Richard worked at UPS for a short time. He later joined a bank in New York's financial district. In Florida, he worked for various Toyota auto dealerships. His last job was at Delray Toyota in Delray Beach, FL. After moving to Florida in the late 1980's, he married Ilean and lived in Palm Beach County.

Richard had a real impact on all of us – and we will always cherish our memories of him. We can't quite believe he's really gone. On Wednesday, January 6, 2021, Richard lost his battle with COVID-19 and he is really gone. However, we know that he is in God's care now and we will see him again someday.

Richard is survived by sons, Kevin, Mark and Patrick, siblings, Earl, Dennis, Grace, Marcia, Dana and Dave; (He is pre-deceased by older siter Dahlia); granddaughter, Brittany; grandson, Kevin Jr.; great-granddaughter, Jade; nieces, Tara, Nikki, Tania, Shakira, Sharifa, Ashley and Shana; nephews, Marlon, Dennis Jr., Jason and Jonathan; and he will be sorely missed by his long-time companion "Gwenny".
