# Obituary

Mrs. Elaine (James) Burton was born on October 20, 1954 in Toledo, OH to the union of the late Oliver and Anna James. Elaine made her transition from earth to heaven on Wednesday, April 08, 2020 peacefully at home. She married her one and only husband, Larry D. Burton. They share three loving daughters.

Elaine professed her hope in Christ at an early age when she joined Morning Star Baptist Church, under the leadership of the late Reverend A.D. Eggleston and Cornelius Byers. After uniting in holy matrimony on August 3, 1974 to Larry D. Burton, they recently celebrated 45 years of marriage this past August. Elaine became a devoted member of The City of Zion, Mount Zion Church in 2000, under the pastorate of Talmadge J. Thomas, she referred to him as her "Beloved Pastor."

At the early age of 12, Elaine taught the youth Sunday School at Morning Star Baptist Church. This was just the beginning of her devoted life to God's service and the church. Her walk with Christ was further developed and enhanced, as she carried the torch from Sis. Esther P. Burton. Dining Department for 10 years. In 1979, she left work and became a full-time Mom. To pursue her dreams, she enrolled in post-secondary education at The University of Toledo and earned her baccalaureate in Education in 1991. Immediately following her undergraduate, academia career, Elaine became employed at Toledo Public Schools and served as a teacher at Glenwood Elementary from 1991-2000. Due to her zeal for education, instruction, and teaching, Elaine continued and obtained her Master's Degree in Educational Administration in 2000. She was then promoted as a School Administrator at East Side Central Elementary School. Elaine worked as an Assistant Principal for two years. Later, she transitioned into the role as the Principal until her retirement in 2009, due to her disability. One of Elaine's educational goals was to complete a few additional courses to earn her Doctorate of Philosophy in Education Administration. Elaine valued and instilled the importance of obtaining a quality education into her children's lives and reminded them that no one could ever take that away.

Elaine had a heart big as Texas and she loved spending time with family and friends! Many of memories are cherished from being born and raised on the southside of Toledo. She enjoyed cooking and "giving orders" at the same time. Frying chicken, fresh corn, hot tamales, the "infamous" dressing, baking homemade cakes from scratch, and making sweet tea are just a few items named. Her Caramel Cake was her "specialty" as she also made the icing from scratch. She refused to share that recipe! Elaine's presence will be deeply missed by all who loved her.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Oliver and Anna James, brother, Oliver James Jr., sister, Elnora Garland. She leaves to cherish loving memories her husband, Larry D. Burton, three dear daughters, Samantha Nance, Keisha Taylor, and LeAnna Burton; four grandchildren, Terrell Jr. and TaKyra Nance, Javen and Dallas Taylor, other relatives, her City of Zion Church family and many friends.
