George W. Blair

George Warren Blair, a man of integrity, determination, and courage passed away on January 1, 2020, at the age of 98.

George was born August 24, 1921, in Sturgis, SD, to Harry and Elizabeth (Johnson) Blair. He was raised on the Blair family ranch near Sturgis with his older sister, Evelyn, and younger sister, Mary. He attended grade school at the Upper Pleasant Valley School and graduated from Sturgis High School in 1939.

In the spring of 1942, he took flying lessons at Spearfish, SD, and enrolled in classes at Black Hills State Teachers College. He met his future wife, Viola Hays, in Algebra class there.

George enlisted in the Army Air Corps in the fall of 1942, and served as a B-25 bomber pilot in the Pacific Theater. On his 47th mission, his plane received enemy fire, and George ditched the plane in the South China Sea. He and all but one of his crew were rescued by a U.S. submarine.

On November 4, 1945, George married Viola Hays in Kent, WA. They ranched in Harding County and in 1956, the family moved to the family ranch near Sturgis.

George led an adventurous life. He hiked the Grand Canyon in his 70's, hiked Bear Butte in his 80's, and tubed down Spearfish Creek in his 90's. For 57 years, his constant companion was his wife, Viola. He was her caregiver for several years before her death in 2002.

His children marveled at his ability to recite poetry, work jigsaw and crossword puzzles, play Scrabble, discuss sports, talk about the weather and politics, and recall local family histories.

George was active in many local and state organizations. He was a member and elder of the First Presbyterian Church of Sturgis. He was elected to the South Dakota House of Representatives in 1978 and served 4 terms in Pierre.

George and Viola raised nine children. George is survived by eight children, Jan Pharr, Mary Beth (Brian) Cornelius, Nancy (Galen) Remington, Gayle (Russ) Urban, Jerry (Kim) Blair, Kathleen (Jeff) Skalbeck, Ann (Gary) Uhde, and Jeff (Cindy) Blair. George is also survived by his sister, Mary (Don) Tech; 26 grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; and many nieces and nephews.


He was preceded in death by his oldest son, John, in 1978; his wife, Viola, in 2002; and his sister, Evelyn, in 2016.
