

Marionette Mahlmann Krogh

was born the daughter of William and Anna (Bischoff) Mahlmann on April 20, 1921 at Fayette in Dunn County, ND. She attended Prospect School #1 and #2 and graduated from Killdeer High School in 1937. After working for the Emergency Crop and Feed Loan Office in Manning, she moved to Killdeer where she worked for the Farm Home Administration and the Agricultural Adjustment Administration Offices. In 1943 Marionette moved to Dickinson and worked in the office of J. C. Penny. On January 17, 1944 she and Alvin Krogh were married at St. Edward's Catholic Church, Fayette, ND. They lived on the Mahlmann homestead during their first year of marriage and moved to their own farm in Billings County in April, 1945. Marionette took the teacher's exam and received her emergency teaching certificate in 1947. While teaching in one room schools in Billings, Dunn, and McKenzie Counties, she earned her teaching degree from Dickinson State College. She taught in North Dakota schools for over 33 years. She and Alvin continued to farm and ranch until 1983 when they moved to Dickinson. They were members of St. Anthony's Club, LeDancer's Dance Club; Scandinavian Ethnic Group, and Dickinson Hardanger Sons of Norway Lodge. Although she was not of Norwegian heritage, she became well known for her Norwegian baking including lefse. She and Alvin enjoyed dancing, playing cards, visiting, gardening and growing roses. Family reunions and neighborhood gatherings were common at their home. Many family and friends received her beautiful crocheted spreads, name tags, Christmas ornaments, and baby blankets. Her homemade bread, caramel rolls and donuts were known far and wide. Marionette passed away December 24th at Benedict Living Community, Dickinson.
