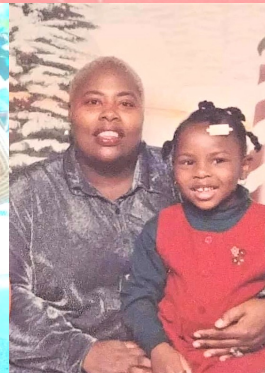
Obituary
